HIGHLIGHTS

 Open Door Pediatrics moved from Hutchinson Avenue to its new home base at Open Door White River, which opened in November 2020. Initially offering pediatrics and WIC services, the full line-up beginning early 2021 also includes family medicine, behavioral health, insurance enrollment, and social support.

 Chiropractic care, pain management, and psychiatric nurse practitioner services were added to offerings. Telehealth by video or phone was added in the first days of the pandemic.

 Open Door Family Planning relocated from Muncie's S. Walnut St. to our main downtown Muncie location at 333 S. Madison St.

• We launched the "Transitions of Care" pilot program, enabling us to receive alerts when one of our patients is seen in the hospital. This allows Open Door providers to proactively follow up.

 Open Door partnered with the Delaware County Department of Health and Indiana Department of Health to become a community COVID-19 testing site. Testing took place at our downtown Muncie health center, Ball State, and at neighborhood-based partner sites.

• Indiana Primary Health Care Association recognized Dr. Max Rudicel as "Provider of the Year" and Kristen Sherman for this year's statewide community health center "Employee of the Year." Dr. Max Rudicel celebrated 50 years practicing medicine.

Family practice and pediatrics providers judged the inaugural "We ART Together" kids' art contest, offering families a creative outlet during COVID-19.

 Open Door was honored to receive the 2019 Athena Organizational Leadership Award, which recognizes an East Central Indiana organization committed to helping women achieve their potential.
